In the **6 months** of the "Med's Assistance" project, the UAO team conducted **20** assistance activities in communities in the **Kherson region**, **15** activities in the **Mykolaiv region**, and **20** activities in the Odessa region. Additionally, in **Odessa**, over **40** assistance activities were held for the affected population.

### **Beneficiary stories:**

We could elaborate on the stories of our beneficiaries and the impact of the project on people's lives extensively, but the best testimonies come from the reviews themselves. In a recent survey, over 400 individuals participated, and each of them shared their comments. We would like to share some of them. The survey was conducted completely anonymously.

"Hello. I want to express my deep gratitude for your support during such a difficult time for all of us. Without your support, I wouldn't have been able to cope. Thank you once again."

"You are the best, your help is extremely necessary for people. From the bottom of my heart, THANK YOU for such necessary support, it's nice to know that such people are nearby, you give us hope for life. Our family lost our home and everything we had, especially our health. A year ago, my husband was diagnosed with colon cancer, he underwent surgery and chemotherapy. I also have enough chronic and current illnesses. I wish you all good health!!! We really hope for further support."

"I am very grateful; you helped with medications for my husband's heart failure, which we couldn't afford on our own. Thank you. Unfortunately, we are alone again, and without your support, it will be very difficult."

"Everything is wonderful. Without your help, I wouldn't have been able to fully undergo treatment. Please forgive any mistakes."

"Thank you sincerely for your help! It is very pleasant and valuable that you accommodated me and purchased three bottles of specialized high-calorie nutrition for my son (who has a disability, subgroup A, and status as a palliative patient). "I'm disabled, IDP. You simply saved me, provided assistance in a difficult moment. Infinitely grateful. I highly value your support. Therefore, I hope that you will not abandon such a vulnerable category as me without support in the future. I beg you not to abandon us! We have no other options to turn to"

"I'm very grateful for the assistance provided. I started treatment for my illness. Without your help, I wouldn't have started treatment at all."

"Our family is very pleased with the UAO team. The girls are very kind, responsive, and friendly, they welcomed us warmly and treated us well. We would like to have more teams and employees like them. Once we received medication, and it helped us so much. Thank you very much for your assistance."

"I need your help; I don't have the means to buy medication. You are our last hope. I can't turn to anyone else in Odessa for help in purchasing the vital medication I need for my health. I ask you to continue helping with medications. You are lifesavers. Thank you for your kindness and compassionate treatment of someone who has found themselves in trouble. My mom and I need you. Please continue your good work"

"Thank you all so much for the help with medications for me and my children. This assistance means a lot to us. I have a chronic condition, rheumatoid arthritis, and I constantly need medication. Recently, I also underwent surgery, after which I developed complications with my intestines. This prevents me from going to work, and the treatment course is long and expensive. You can't imagine how much you're helping. Wishing you all good health"

## Survey Results

- UAO conducted a survey among local authorities, local government employees, and NGOs in the Odessa, Mykolaiv, and Kherson regions. 14 respondents participated. According to the survey results, 92.9% indicated the most needed assistance as "Medication and medical supplies by individual prescription," 50% indicated diapers, 28.6% chose "First aid kit" sets without prescription drugs and general-purpose medical supplies. 78.6% mentioned that no other organization provided assistance in the form of essential medicines and medical supplies for individual treatment in their communities and settlements. All respondents expressed satisfaction with their collaboration with the UAO team.
- UAO also conducted a survey among beneficiaries, including individuals who had not yet received assistance from UAO. A total of 422 respondents participated, which came as a surprise to us and demonstrated the strong connection between the UAO team and its beneficiaries. According to the survey results, 80% of respondents were female. Regarding age distribution, 8.3% were under 18 years old, 54.8% were between 18- 59 years old, and 44.1% were 60 years old or older. Among them, 60% were internally displaced persons (IDPs), 40% were people with disabilities, 10.1% were affected by armed aggression against Ukraine, and 21.5% were individuals facing difficult life circumstances.

A significant portion of respondents (85.1%) received medication and medical supplies by individual prescription from UAO, 17.9% were provided with diapers, 5.9% indicated that they received free tests and examinations through UAO, 7.3% received informational and consultative support from medical professionals, and 15% received vitamins from UAO.

Regarding the ability to provide for oneself with treatment resources, 66.7% of respondents indicated that they could not do so at all, 30.4% said they could provide for themselves partially, and only 2.8% of beneficiaries had the ability to provide themselves with medications and medical supplies. These findings reflect the current situation and underscore the critical need for assistance, which has a significant impact on people's lives.

Additionally, the survey presented various assistance options for selection, including "First aid kit" sets without prescription drugs and general-purpose medical supplies (37.7% of votes), "Med's Assistance" Prescription medications and medical supplies (84.4%), Diapers (25.5%), and "Women's Health Kit" Hygiene products, pregnancy tests, preventive medications, HIV, Hepatitis B and C tests (15.6%).

Overall, 96.2% of respondents expressed satisfaction with the support and assistance provided by UAO. The comments shared by respondents in the survey deeply moved all members of our team, providing further encouragement to continue moving forward and building our future together.
